



### **GEORGE**DARWIN RAGSDALE



### **DIRECTOR**

### **MORGAN URBANOVSKY**

Morgan is a multidisciplinary theatre artist and Austin native specializing in safe, consent-based, and equitable theatre practices that protect the well-being and autonomy of all artists. She focuses on amplifying voices that have been suppressed or silenced and uplifting their stories. Morgan teaches middle and high school students in the Austin area while pursuing a master's degree from East Texas A&M University and a Master of Fine Arts from the University of Idaho, studying feminist theatre concepts that subvert the traditional canon.

While obtaining her bachelor's degree at Texas A&M University - Corpus Christi, Morgan directed the Inaugural Seed Project. This process allows one student to direct a full-length, budgeted production of their choice, where she directed her first main-stage project, *Smokefall* by Noah Haidle. In 2018, she directed *Hand to God* by Robert Askins, winning Best Director and Best Capstone Project. In 2024, she made her directorial debut at the Georgetown Palace Theatre with *Doubt* by John Patrick Shanley.

In addition to directing, Morgan served as a stage combat and intimacy coordinator and is an active combatant with the Society of American Fight Directors.

Morgan approaches projects with a fresh perspective, collaborating with amazing artists to bring high-quality theatre to local stages.

### SCENIC DESIGNER MORGAN TAYLOR MYERS

Morgan has spent over a decade working in the arts. He has showcased his talents as a musician, writer, actor, and stagehand since the age of 12. Focusing solely on backstage work and technical arts, he received a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Theatre from Texas State University. Taylor started his professional career with large arena and concert work at the University of Texas at Austin's Frank Erwin Center, focusing on lighting work. 
